

Monster, Bloom's style

In this activity, you will be required to utilize all of your thinking skills—application, comprehension, application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation.

Thoughtfully complete the written prompts below. You may use your book as a reference and the back of the page if you need more space.

Knowledge: Name the characters that have been mentioned in the novel thus far.

Comprehension: Describe the scene where Steve is staying. What does it look like? How does Steve express that he feels about it?

Application: Demonstrate your knowledge of Steve's feelings by writing a journal entry from Steve's perspective about what he misses from the outside world. What would he think about? Would he regret anything?

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Analysis: Diagram the night of the murder. Include the details that you know thus far in the story of what occurred and who was there. Dissect known fact from opinion in two columns on the page.

Synthesis: Compose a newscaster's dialogue of Steve's story. Remember to include specifics. Evaluation: Predict the end of the story. Back up your prediction with evidence and solid thinking.

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
